#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Silence in the Mass: the introduction of the priest to the Penitential Act begins with an invitation to reflect on the mystery of sin and God's mercy and love. After the priest's introduction, the people are invited to recollect themselves in silence. This is not a time for an examination of conscience, that is, to think of what sins we have committed. Rather it is a time to recall our sinful nature and rejoice in the saving love of God, that is lavished on us despite our unworthiness. Thus, it is a time to focus on the primacy of God's action, who loved us while we were still sinners. It is an opportunity to remember that God first loved us and called us together as a people anointed by the Spirit of Jesus. As an introduction to the Mass, the silent reflection of the Penitential Act helps us spiritually to focus on the heart and central action of the Eucharist: to give praise and thanks to God. Thus it is an invitation and time to prepare our hearts to praise God's mercy.
