GOSPEL REFLECTION:

The Scripture Readings this Sunday remind us that Christianity from the beginning was communitarian in nature. Jesus never intended an individualistic doit-yourself approach to salvation. They also remind us that our relationship with God exists because of what God has done for us. The images in the First Reading and Gospel recall this intimacy. "I bore you on eagle wings," "You shall be my special possession," and "his heart was moved to pity" are telling us how God has first loved us. Saint Paul also tells us that we are called and brought into a special relationship with God not because of anything we have done. We are justified and reconciled with God because of the death and resurrection of Christ. It is not something we can do on our own. Exodus also assures us that it was God who brought Israel to Sinai. It was on God's initiative that salvation or the freeing of Israel from the slavery of Egypt was accomplished. God's compassion is also revealed through the ministry of Jesus. Now he sends the apostles and us forth to continue his work of preaching the Good News. We live today in this special relationship, with the corresponding obligations that we have as God's people. The message of Good News is not meant only for ourselves. God reminded Israel that "all the earth is mine." Like the apostles, we too are sent forth with power to proclaim the goodness of our God.
