

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke's Gospel depicts Jesus at prayer from the very beginning of his ministry. His life begins with prayer in the Temple at Jerusalem, when Zechariah is told that his prayer for a child has been heard. The birth of Jesus is woven together around the prayers of Zechariah, Mary, Simeon, Anna, angels and shepherds. So many of the major moments of Jesus' life are linked with prayer: at his baptism; before the choosing of the Twelve; at the Transfiguration, the Last Supper, and even unto death on the cross. In each prayerful moment, Jesus lives out the story of God's great dialogue with the human family by remaining totally open to the power of God. Luke tells us that Jesus sometimes prayed all night and on the night of his arrest. Luke insists on the importance of prayer for the Christian life. We must pray unceasingly, for prayer is a sign of our faith in God. Prayer is not something that we use to put pressure on God to get our own way. Authentic prayer opens us up to the action of God's Spirit, bringing us in line with God's desires, and making us into true disciples, obedient to Jesus and to the Father who has sent him. We pray because we recognize that by ourselves, we are powerless. We pray because it is one of the ways by which we follow Jesus. We pray to be like Christ and to be with Christ, now and forever. We pray because we are one family and seek union with our Father.


