How do Church Envelopes work? In Canada, the only support Churches receive is from the offerings of the parishioners. However, the Government of Canada allows a percentage of the annual donation to be a tax deduction when you file your Income Tax Return. In order to do this, Churches must be able to show how much money a person gave to the Church. Thus, Church envelopes or Pre-authorized bank deductions allow the Churches to keep this record. The deduction is 15% of the first \$200.00 and 29% of the remaining.

January 1 - New Year's Day - is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God and the World Day of Prayer for Peace in the Catholic Church. At both the New Year's Eve and Day Masses, we will have a special form of the Prayer of the Faithful asking our Blessed Lady to intercede for Peace in our world.
