GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the Sunday Readings there is a three year cycle. Lent has the option of always using the Readings from Cycle A, known as the Readings for the Scrutinies. These are always used when there are adults or children to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Thus the Readings for the next three Sundays will be proclaimed from Cycle A, the Readings for the Scrutinies. On this Third Sunday, the theme of thirst runs through John's Gospel: from the meeting with the Samaritan woman, to the prophecy during the feast of the Tabernacles, to the cross, when Jesus before he dies says, to fulfill Scripture: "I thirst." The thirst of Christ is a gateway into the mystery of God, who made himself thirsty to refresh us, as he made himself poor to enrich us (cf. 2 Corinthians 8:9). Yes, God thirsts for our faith and our love. Like a good and merciful Father he desires for us all possible good, and this good is God himself. For her part the Samaritan woman represents the emptiness of those who have not found what they are looking for. But everything changes with her conversation with the Lord Jesus, who speaks to her heart so much so that she leaves the water jar and runs to tell the people of the village: "Come and see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" Let us too open our hearts to the confident hearing of the word of God in order that Christ may satisfy us with living water and inflame our hearts with his love.
