GOSPEL REFLECTION

The end of the world will happen one day; even science acknowledges this. For the disciples of Jesus, the end of the world means the beginning of a new world. Jesus invites us to live now in a way that will give us life in the world to come. The first reading speaks about the destruction of evil and evildoers, but today most people do not want to think about the end or judgment, and everyone presumes that God will protect everyone from the results of their evil actions. The truth is that while God gives us freedom even to commit evil deeds, these evil actions produce evil in our world, and we must bear the responsibility for our actions. We see this so clearly in the almost total loss of values today. So many people today believe that we humans can do anything we want, and that nothing bad results from it. We don't want to recognize any connection with the present lack of values and the many incidents of violence, the wars, the trafficking of humans, the breakup of families, and so on. We believe that we can fix everything on our own terms. The Scriptures, however, constantly remind us that God alone can save us, and this is the message that our belief in the end of the world affords. Thus, the real teaching of the readings is not about the end of the world, but about how to live in this world here and now. Even if it looks like everything is about to end, the most important aspect is for us to remain faithful to God and to God's word.
