GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Having received God's abundant mercy we are challenged to become merciful ourselves and transform our hardened hearts to compassionate hearts. As Paul reminds the Romans, the way we live has its influence on others. Showing mercy is the result of an inner conversion and of better reflecting the God in whose image we are created. The surprising forgiveness of God in showing us mercy when we expect judgement invites us to move on from the power or blame game of playing innocent to recognizing ourselves as forgiven debtors, in a fellowship of similar debtors. Even on a human level, bearing grudges or being mad at others saps more energy on our part than on the person who offended us. Why do we give control over our lives to others. Jesus wants us to be free. and forgiveness is the hallmark of love and the only key to freedom. Does revenge actually bring healing or release or remedy from injury? Think of the people you see being interviewed on the news who are seeking revenge for an injury. No matter how great the injury, vengeance will not lead them to acceptance and freedom. As the Book of Sirach states: "Does anyone harbour anger against another, and expect healing from the Lord?"
