GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Today's parable is a summary of salvation history. First God chose the children of Israel to be his people to whom he would reveal his love and salvation. When they ignored his invitation he sent the prophets, but even these they rejected and killed. Next God sent his Son as an invitation to the peoples of all nations. These accepted the invitation, but there is a reminder that accepting the invitation carries with it an obligation to live the message of faith, hope and love. This life of holiness is symbolized by the wedding garment which is a necessary condition for entrance. God's anger must be understood as an expression of God's determination to make things right in this world. God is unchanging love, and not even human sin and disobedience can thwart his desire to bring to fulfilment the beautiful vision in Isaiah of a great feast. God will host this feast for humanity where truth, justice, and holiness will reign unhindered. God's justice will not allow the forces of evil to triumph. This parable like the others is a reassuring one that reminds us that God will not allow his plan of salvation to be obstructed.
