

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel starts us on the road to Bethlehem by recounting the beginning of the disruption to St Joseph's life. This comes through the angel of the Lord in a dream. Joseph from this moment encounters a God who will not let him be; his life is disrupted and now focuses on this child. Joseph's concern to care for this child and his protection of him will take him on a journey beyond his imagination, guided by grace, guided by his fidelity to this child. As we continue our journey through advent, we are aware that we are preparing for the celebration of the coming of the child in the manger. It is part of our task of preparation that we come to see that the Christ child is worthy of our full and undivided attention. But is also part of that preparation to understand that this will necessarily change and disrupt our lives in ways that we might not expect. Will we welcome that disruption?
