GOSPEL REFLECTION

The essence of Christianity, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." Today the Gospel presents us with the death of Christ, knowing that God raised him from death, thus giving us hope of rising with him. The Cross of Christ has been a potent symbol throughout the ages. Its vertical axis joins heaven and earth, and its horizontal axis joins all ages and races of humanity; everything meets in the broken body of Christ. The Christian faith without the Cross is nothing. The Cross tells us that our goodness is not good enough. We cannot 'achieve' God by our own efforts; nevertheless, we try to possess and shape God to our own desires, needs and image as a sign of our own achievements without the Cross in life. Our ego loves to make God our servant and is always ready to imagine that it has done so in fact. A popular view of Christianity in the lives of most people today is one without the Cross of Christ. It is well to remember that Saint Paul wrote, "we preach Christ crucified." (1 Cor 1:23). The Cross marks a narrow and hard road, but it is the narrow road that leads to life. First of all, the Scriptures, and then the saints and mystics, vouch for this. First the narrow way, then the opening out into the fullness of life. A Christianity without the Cross has never worked and will never do so. It doesn't do justice to the awesome depths of human life and death revealed in Christ Jesus. It takes a crucified Church to bring a crucified Christ before the eyes of the world.
