GOSPEL REFLECTION

“The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself” is a wise saying from the Book of Sirach, the first reading for this Sunday’s Mass. This advice, to be humble no matter what our vocation is in life, refers to an interior disposition, which manifests itself in conduct of gentleness and kindness. No follower of Christ should be above or beyond such a stance. To be truly humble means acceptance of being a creature and not being God, admitting one’s imperfections and depending on God for all that may be good within us. The opposite of humility, of course, is pride. Scripture warns that the proud are to be pitied, not because they are intrinsically evil, but because that they are unable to see the truth, to admit their need for God. The humble, on the other hand, are ever open to God’s word and action in their life, eager to give a ready ear to all who are instruments of God’s grace in daily life: family members, colleagues at work, schoolmates, community or parish members.
