

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's readings are about remembering and thanksgiving, healing and salvation. In the First Reading, Naaman the Syrian remembers to thank Elisha for his cure, and one of the 10 lepers cured by Jesus remembered to return and thank his healer. In the Second Reading from the Second Letter of Paul to Timothy, Paul asks Timothy (and us) to remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead. Recalling Jesus' death and resurrection fills us with gratitude, heals and strengthens us to face any adversity, difficulty and suffering, thus making us people of gratitude.

The Eucharist is a reminder never to forget God's greatest gift to us, his own Son, our Saviour. If we concentrate too much on asking for things, there is a danger that we may reduce our Mass to the level of magical thinking, a way of turning God to our way of thinking. How much better if we can open our hearts and our lives to whatever God wants for us, which is sure to be the best that can happen to us in the long run. As Canadians we celebrate Thanksgiving this weekend, let us give this time a religious foundation: let us stop for a moment to remember the goodness and salvation of the Lord, then let us truly give thanks to the Lord our God, for it is truly right and just.
