GOSPEL REFLECTION

Epiphany means to reveal. Thus today's feast unfolds the meaning of Jesus' birth as the long awaited Messiah and Saviour. During this season three events are celebrated: the star leads the Magi to the stable; water is changed into wine at the wedding feast at Cana; and Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan for our salvation. In these events Jesus progressively reveals himself to all peoples with signs comprehensible to them. To shepherds he sends an angel; to the wise who scrutinize the courses of the heavenly bodies he sends a star; to the Jews attached to signs, he gives the sign of baptism and anointing by the Spirit and changing water into wine. Jesus said the signs of the presence of the Kingdom of God are that: "The blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are healed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the good news preached to them" (Matt. 11:5). These signs are present for our generation as well. Through us, the Body of Christ, the spiritually blind can receive the light of faith through the word of God; the spiritually lame can find new strength to join the pilgrimage to God's Kingdom; those who are prisoners of any kind of evil can be freed from their chains; the spiritually poor can share in the divinity of Christ. In other words, all people can be converted and live through the power of Christ and his Spirit. However, as in the days of the magi, there are those who are overjoyed by the Epiphany of Christ, and there are those who are threatened by it. Today as in his own time, the revelation of Christ enters a hostile world. As Herod was threatened by a possible rival, we must realize that this spiritual revelation of Christ threatens the worldly and physical life style and world view of many people today. Let us pray that we are the wise people who recognize the signs.


