GOSPEL REFLECTION:

We often forget that a unique characteristic of our faith is that the biblical God is a God who speaks!" He writes on the heart and makes his words resonate there. God does not have a mouth or breath, but the prophet is his mouth and the Holy Spirit is his breath. "You will be my mouth," God says to the prophets, "I will put my word on your lips." This is the meaning of the phrase "human beings moved by the Holy Spirit spoke under the influence of God" (2 Peter 1:21). Just as our mind originates thoughts and concepts and translates them into words, so God sends his message that is translated into human words, which is then impressed upon the prophets' mind. This is God's way of speaking that is addressed to the mind and heart. So alive and real is God's speaking, that the prophet recalls with precision the place, day and time that a certain word came to him. For us, the word of God that the prophet speaks is like a seed planted in our mind that can grow and blossom into new ideas and understanding that move us to deepen our faith, grow in love and perform deeds of charity.
