GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the Dedication of the Cathedral of St John Lateran. This is the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome, and as such it is Pope Leo's Cathedral. Carved in front of the Church are the words: "mother and head of all the churches of Rome and the world." St. Peter's in the Vatican is not a cathedral, it is a shine church in honour of St. Peter. St. John was the first Christian church building. The ground for it was donated by the Emperor Constantine early in the 4th century. This feast reminds us that a church building is a symbol of a believing community. It is a place where we search for and meet God, and God searches for us and meets us there. As the Pope is the visible Head of the universal Church, so his Cathedral is a symbol of the unity of the whole Church and the Christian community. In the First Reading St. Paul reminds us of this mystery of being the church of God. He writes: "you are God's building you are God's temple." More fundamental than the building we call church are the people we call church. Each church building helps us to express our identity as a people of faith called to worship God through Christ in the Spirit. If our worship is to be authentic, the shape of our worship must become the shape of our lives. Our whole lives are to be a movement towards God, through Christ and in the Spirit. This is what it means to be Church, to be the temple of God in the world. This is the heart of our baptismal calling.


