GOSPEL REFLECTION

We often hear that word “mystery” in the prayers of the Mass. The mystery is the complexity of our life: the known and the unknown that is mixed in together. For that is what love does. I will be with you and love you no matter where life takes us. Mystery affirms the reality of love that will be a constant in our lives, but it acknowledges that the circumstances of life will change, but love will make it worthwhile. Mystery also conveys the element of wonder and awe. The mystery is why does God love us even though we are sinners. The mystery is how God is tied to us as He created us, revealed himself in the Law and Prophets and finally redeemed us by sending his Son as a human being. God could have chosen to redeem us in many ways. An act of the will, a word from God, that would have been sufficient. Yet he chose the Incarnation, that Christ the eternal Word and Son of the Father should become a human being. This God must truly love human beings whom He created in order to do this. God will not be separated from his creation and from the creatures He made in his own image and likeness. But that should not surprise us. God is a God of action. Love compels action. Love compelled God to create, to reveal and to save us. The Gospel then invite us into this mystery.
