Hollowe'en is Tuesday, October 31. There will be no 5:15 pm Mass that evening. Let's use that day to remember and celebrate God's grace in all the Saints who have hollowed our lives and revealed God's mercy and grace for all humanity.

**GOSPEL REFLECTION:** The Gospel today is the third time that the Pharisees come to test Jesus. Each time shows their duplicity and evil intentions. This time the question concerns the greatest commandment. Given that there were over 600 laws in the Jewish covenant, it might seem like a valid question. The question is valid, the motive and sincerity is not. In response Jesus shows His mastery of sacred Scripture when he first cites Moses' command to Israel in Deuteronomy (6:5) "to love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul". These words form the Shema, the prayer at the heart of daily Jewish worship. The command to "love your neighbour as yourself" can be seen to summarize the Law as seen in the reading from Exodus urging our concern for the stranger (or immigrant), the widow (or singleparent), and the orphan (or children in care). Jesus is not replacing these more detailed requirements of social justice and compassion, however adept we may be at ignoring their demands in present-day society. If God wants us is to love Him and to love one another, why do we find ourselves so incapable of such a simple commandment? When we are honest with ourselves, we admit that there is something broken in our humanity. Our Catholic Tradition calls this "original sin" and because of our sinfulness, the Father sends His Son to save us in the power of the Holy Spirit.
