GOSPEL REFLECTION

Silence in the Opening or Collect Prayer: When the priest says, "Let us pray," this introduces a time of silence for prayer. The ancient name of this prayer, the "collect" reminds us that the priest collects all our prayers and unites them in one prayer to God. In a sense this is a spiritual collection. What should we pray for? What should we offer to God? We might pray for an openness to listen to God's words, or that we will be transformed into the image of Christ or that we will be faithful to God's calling or that we will come to the kingdom of eternal glory. For those who use missalettes, this might be the opportunity to read the prayer in silence, so that when it is proclaimed by the priest, we can listen to it and make it a prayer from our heart.
