GOSPEL REFLECTION

The story of Mary and Martha is special and unique to Luke. It is mentioned nowhere else in the Gospel tradition. It follows immediately on the story of the Good Samaritan. As this latter story emphasises the importance of serving one's neighbour, the story of Mary and Martha stresses the importance of the contemplative side of the Christian life. By gently chiding the diligent hostess, Martha, for her fretting and worrying over her duties, Jesus is making the point that the concerns and demands of daily life should not distract one from paying attention to the word of the Master. By listening to that word, one's understanding of the Master grows, and one's commitment to his service and to the service to one's neighbour is strengthened. Jesus does not downgrade action at the expense of contemplation. His point is that contemplation can motivate truly Christian action and can give deeper meaning to the many activities in which the Christian is involved.

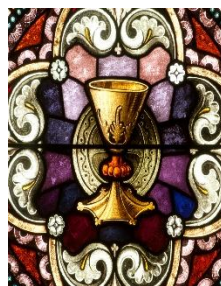

Saturday, **October 4th, from 9:00 a.m to 3:30 p.m.**

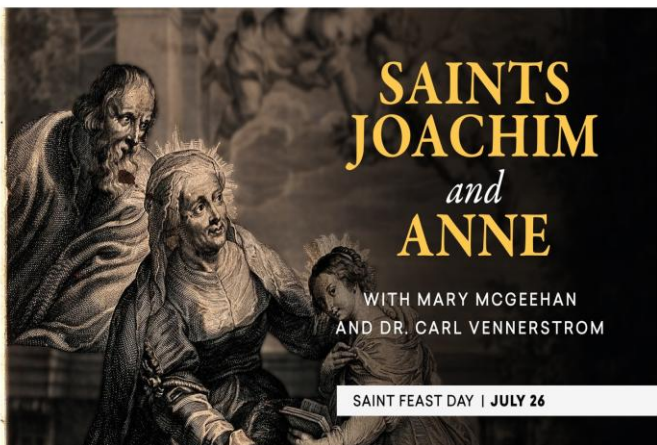
