GOSPEL REFLECTION

Our Lord continues his teaching about prayer in Luke's Gospel. Prayer has been called "an hour of truth." But it has to be more than the truth. No doubt the Pharisee was telling the truth: he was living an upright life; he was doing everything he claimed to be doing. But he was not praying; he was giving God an inventory of his good deeds. His high opinion of himself depended on his low opinion of others. Prayer, in order to be genuine, must have at least five characteristics: (1) It should be devout, that is it should focus on God and not ourselves; (2) it should flow from our faith, hope, and love, and not from pride; (3) It must be humble because while we are created in the image of God, we are also sinners and we must admit that; (4) Our prayer must be accompanied by repentance. This is more than sorrow for sin; it is also a recognition that we are constantly in need of God's loving mercy, and that anything good we do is the result of God's redeeming grace. (5) Prayer should be characterized by joy. Our repentance leads us to joy for even when we sin, we know God is gracious and we are loved by God beyond all our imagining. But the way to true prayer and holiness is to discover that I'm a bigger sinner than I ever thought I was! The closer I come to God, the more obvious the sin is. It is a long journey from the Pharisee at the front to the tax-collector at the back. It is a journey of repentance and of facing up to the truth.

PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR ALL SOULS OCTIVE

The Vatican's Apostolic Penitentiary, in its "[Enchiridion Indulgentiarum](#)" ("Handbook of Indulgences"), states that the faithful can obtain a plenary indulgence for the faithful departed "every day, from the 1st to the 8th of November," if, in addition to fulfilling the normal terms of a plenary indulgence, one "devoutly visit[s] a cemetery and at least mentally pray[s] for the dead."

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. In order to obtain a plenary indulgence the faithful must — in addition to being in the state of grace — both have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin (even venial sin), have sacramentally confessed their sins and received the Eucharist (either within or outside of Mass), and must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.

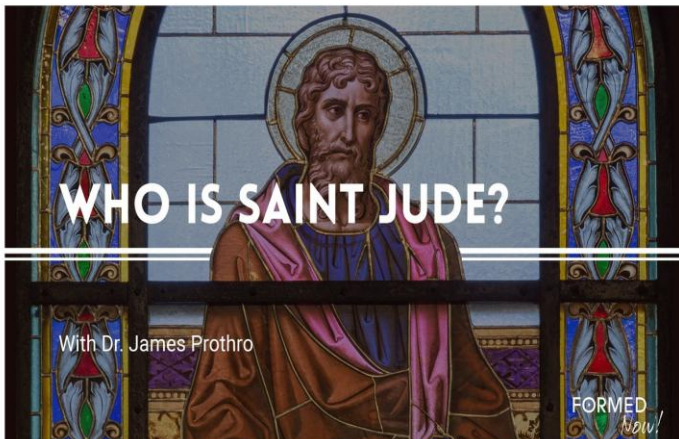
