GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Jesus offers another parable about the Kingdom and the growing of seeds, which reminds us of the guiet and slow ways that God's Kingdom grows among us and within us. Central to the parable of the wheat and the weeds is the preciousness of the wheat. The landowner refuses to lose any of it, in order to get rid of the weeds. The weed resembles the wheat and, growing next to the wheat, may think it shares the same destiny with the wheat, but its end is destruction. The weed is harmful to the wheat, its roots will starve the wheat from the very source of its nourishment. The refusal of the householder to allow his slaves to separate the wheat from the weeds while they are still growing is a warning to the disciples not to attempt to anticipate the final judgment of God by a definitive exclusion of sinners from the Kingdom. The judgment of God alone will eliminate the sinful. Until then there must be patience and the preaching of repentance. We can learn much from God's patience as we see Him allow both the good and the evil to grow together. It is important to remember this point when we grow so impatient with God's role in human history.
