GOSPEL REFLECTION

In a festive way the Church celebrates the Paschal Mystery for 50 days: Jesus Christ's redemptive passion, death and resurrection. We live out of this mystery as a new creation. In the Book of Revelation, the number 7 is used to describe the fullness of Christ's presence. Thus, there are 7 weeks of Easter; 7 candles are used in the altar area. Over the span of 50 days, the seven Sundays of Easter celebrate the resurrection and the paschal mystery through the biblical readings. But of course, every Sunday is the weekly celebration of the Passover [Jesus Christ's death and resurrection]." Easter is the centre of the year as Sunday is to the week. And so we proclaim: "We praise you with greater joy than ever in this Easter season, when Christ became our paschal sacrifice. He has made us children of the light, rising to new and everlasting life. He has opened the gates of Heaven to receive his faithful people. His death is our ransom from death; His resurrection is our rising to life. The joy of the resurrection renews the whole world, while the choirs of heaven sing for ever to your glory..." (Easter Preface II)

Through the intercession and example of our Blessed Mother Mary, Queen of Peace, grant us the wisdom and humility to reflect that peace to the world. 
