**GOSPEL REFLECTION:** The wedding banquet is a frequent image of eternal life, for we can only speak about the unknown and spiritual in terms of what is known and part of our experience. The wedding banquet speaks of eternal life as the deepest hunger and thirst in our lives that will be satisfied, especially the hunger and thirst for love, for God who is love. In the second reading, Saint Paul speaks of life beyond death in a similar vein-it is that eternal moment when "God will bring those who have died with him" and when "we shall stay with the Lord forever." Eternal life will mean entering into a new and fuller relationship with God and. through him, with all creation. The parable also warns us that it is possible to exclude ourselves from the banquet of eternal life. It was only those who were ready, who went in with the bridegroom to the wedding hall. When God comes to bring us, will we be ready? Life, including life after death is God's gift to us and a gift. by definition, can be refused, Our daily attitudes will determine our attitude at the moment of death. Prayer keeps us awake and ready to watch and think about Christ. To pray is to grow in receptivity to God's presence within us.
