#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

**TODAY IS GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY when Jesus** emphasizes the self-sacrificing element in his own life. He contrasts the good shepherd who owns the sheep with someone who is simply hired to look after them and who thinks primarily of his own welfare. The good shepherd knows his sheep and they know him. There is a mutual bond of love and intimacy. That love is compared to the deep mutual relationship that exists between Jesus and his Father. Again the hired hand will not have such a relationship with his charges. The good shepherd deeply desires that many other sheep should come to identify themselves with him. The ultimate goal is that the whole world will be united together with its God and Lord. Today is also Vocation Sunday when we pray for leaders in the Church to spread the Gospel; not just that others answer that call, but we too answer that call. Every single one of us has a vocation. Each one of us should be asking ourselves: Is what I am spending my energies on every day my real vocation? How am I giving witness to my Christian faith? How am I a spreader of truth, of love, of justice, of freedom, of tolerance and acceptance? If every single one us were to answer that question sincerely and to act upon it our Church would have the leadership it needs.
