GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Holy Family had to face many issues not unlike those of our own households. In those days, the men on pilgrimage walked with the men's group, and the women with the women. Only in the evening would the two groups come together. Mary assumed that Jesus was travelling with the men, and Joseph assumed that the boy was with his mother, a classic case of family misunderstanding! After a whole day's travel, Joseph and Mary discover that the boy has gone off on his own. Fortunately, the Gospel tells us something quite different about the childhood of Jesus, in a down-to-earth way. In this story of misunderstanding, we can feel quite close to the Holy Family of Nazareth. They are real people, after all, who had their ups and downs as a family, just like your family and mine. They had their problems, their struggles and their challenges, just like your family and mine. But they survived as a family, just like yours and mine. They survived, because there was enough love, acceptance and forgiveness between them, and enough trust in both God and one another. Indeed the Holy Family can be closer to our lives than we realise. Today we pray for their guidance in our own family life.

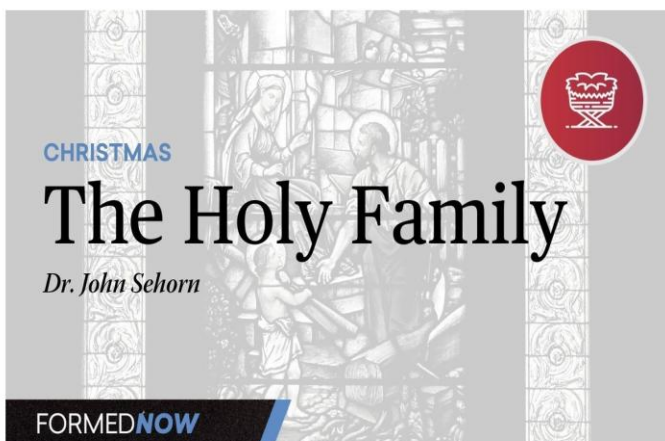
