GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel from Matthew begins the public ministry of Jesus, in which Matthew quotes the prophecy of Isaiah, which is today's first reading. One of the major themes of Matthew's Gospel is that Jesus is the fulfillment of the whole of the Old Testament, the Jewish Scriptures. The more that we can understand the Old Testament, the more we can understand Jesus Himself. Matthew also tells us about the call of Peter and Andrew and James and John. We might ask why would these fishermen respond so readily to the call of Jesus? But the more important question is, why don't we respond as readily to His call? He will free us from all bondage to sin if we let Him! He will help be united with one another and with all Christians, if we let Him. While most of us have already answered the call of Jesus in our vocation, Jesus is also inviting us to become extraordinary disciples in that vocation and to give our lives completely to Him. In this way the whole world can be transformed with the gift of salvation if only we walk in the ways of Christ, who is the fulfillment of our own longings. This is the goal of our parish as we celebrate the Feast of Saint Paul, and it is also the goal of our Archdiocese as we celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the creation of this diocese in 1826.

You are cordially invited to a service of Prayer and Anointing of the Sick to mark the beginning of the Celebration of the 200th

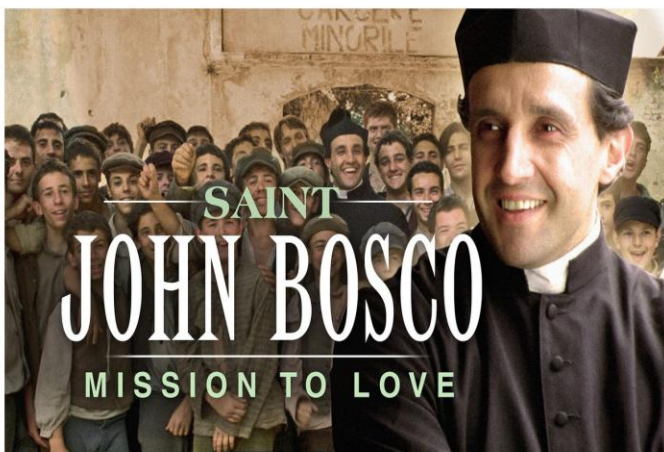
