Hollowe'en is Tuesday, October 31. There will be no 5:15 pm Mass that evening. Let's use that day to remember and celebrate God's grace in all the Saints who have hollowed our lives and revealed God's mercy and grace for all humanity.

GOSPEL REFLECTION:

Today's First Reading reveals a new discovery for Israel and for the prophet. The God of Israel is also the God of all the nations. Previously it was thought that each nation had its own god. Now the prophet sees that God is working through a pagan king to fulfill God's plan of returning the exiled Jewish people to their own homeland. There is only one God, and He is God of all nations and peoples. He can use anyone for his purpose. When God's will is followed there is harmony between religion and state. The clash between religion and the secular state is not new, and it is a sign that God's will and plan of salvation are not uppermost in people's mind and action. The history of the world is largely a history of this conflict. But these opposing claims of God and state are, in reality artificial, for there is only one God and he is the Lord and Master of the whole universe and of all people and history. It is human beings who separate them, in order to claim power, honour and wealth for themselves, at the expense of others and God. But there remains the warning of Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, that "no one can serve two masters; one cannot be the slave of both God and wealth" (Mt 6:24).
