GOSPEL REFLECTION

"If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above." The readings remind us there is always a danger that we loose a sense of eternal life and live only for the values of this world alone. We call this Christian virtue detachment, which is the opposite of covetousness. Christian detachment does not take away the value of earthly realities, but keeps us aware that there is more to come. If we set our hearts on being rich, on having a wonderful career, on possessions, or on anything else, we will find ourselves disappointed. Those realities can be wonderful if they help us love others more. In other words, if we use the realities of this world to embrace the reality of the world to come (love God and love neighbour), then the realities of this world are useful to us in a very good way. It is so easy for us to be seduced by the values of this world because they seem so pleasant and bring such pleasure. The challenge is to keep our eyes on Jesus" and allow ourselves to be formed by what he told us. Let us pray that we will always walk with the Lord Jesus and with his Church.

The month of August is dedicated to The Immaculate Heart of Mary.

The Miraculous Medal is a Catholic medal that symbolizes the intercession of Mary, the

Immaculate Conception, and protection from evil. Front Side: Depicts Mary Immaculate, her hands open, full of light, standing on a globe with a serpent beneath her feet, symbolizing her power over evil.

Back Side: Features a cross and two hearts: one representing Jesus and the other representing Mary, symbolizing their union.

Purpose: It is worn by Catholics as a sign of faith and protection, believed to bring great graces and spiritual benefits.

The medal was revealed to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830, and since then, it has been associated with numerous miracles attributed to its wearers.


