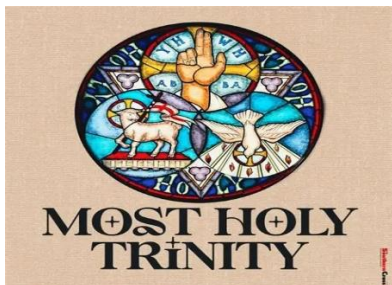

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The doctrine of the Trinity which we celebrate this Sunday is at the heart of the Christian religion, not because it offers us a mysterious dogma, but because it articulates the relationship of shared love into which we are drawn for our life and salvation. God is love and the Three Persons in the Trinity represent the fullness of love. The Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father. The Holy Spirit is their love for each other. We are made in the image of a triune God. God the Father, who created us, his Son who saved us, and the Holy Spirit who continues to guide us. Born into a human family, our lives also reflect the life and love of the Trinity. For like the Trinity we are called to live in a loving relationship. The Trinity is living in us and in our families, and in our families we reflect the Trinity. The life and love of God is ours, and it is to be ours even more. Jesus said, "It is the Father living in me who is doing this work" (Jn 14:10). Because we are his Body we are entitled to say the same. For this let's give heartfelt thanks and praise.

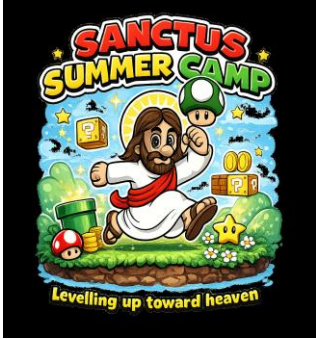
