## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Even though we call them the Holy Family that does not mean they never had problems to face, as every family must. Just as each follower of Jesus has a cross to carry, so also the holy family had to experience the cross in their shared life. We can imagine how misunderstood both Mary and Joseph must have been about the conception of Jesus before they came to live together. The birthplace of Jesus was an animal shelter, since no better lodgings could be found. Today's Gospel from Luke illustrates what trials were faced by Mary and Joseph in trying to understand the development of Jesus as a young person. In the Temple Simeon had predicted that a sword of sorrow would pierce Mary's soul. At the end, Mary had to watch her son die on the Cross. What sustained the family of Nazareth through all of these trials and crosses? It is love and trust that holds families together in difficult times. Whenever families are happy, it is where love and respect are highly prized. We pray for an outpouring of those qualities in our families today because a major threat to family life is that we don't spend enough time together. We are so busy working, socializing, using our electronic gadgets or watching TV that we have no time to talk to each other.

January 1 - New Year's Day - is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God and the World Day of Prayer for Peace in the Catholic Church. How do Church Envelopes work? In Canada, the only support Churches receive is from the offerings of the parishioners. However, the Government of Canada allows a percentage of the annual donation to be a tax deduction when you file your Income Tax Return. In order to do this, Churches must be able to show how much money a person gave to the Church. Thus, Church envelopes or Pre-authorized bank deductions allow the Churches to keep this record. The deduction is 15% of the first \$200.00 and 29% of the remaining.
