GOSPEL REFLECTION:

At first sight, today's parable seems to suggest that the third servant took a prudent course of action—"I heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown." The scribes and Pharisees, towards whom it was directed, would argue: God demands perfection; the Law expresses his will; only a scrupulous observance of the Law can give us security. But God's way is different: He wants an abundant harvest. Jesus wants us to know that salvation come to those who are prepared to risk their all for him. A talent is given to bear fruit, not to lie unused. It may seem prudent not to risk, but in the end it is not what God expects of us. As Jesus said: those who lose their life will save it.
