

# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus using the traditional Jewish greeting twice: "Shalom" or "Peace be with you". The first time is when he appears in the room where the disciples were gathered after his resurrection. The second is when they are gathered eight days later. The peace of Christ is also a gift offered to each of us as individuals by Christ. It has great power in the lives of each one of us as individual believers, because it meets a deep need in each of us. But its greatest power is manifested when we see how this gift builds us not just as individuals, but as individuals in communion with one another as disciples of Christ. This surrender of our individualism for the common good is the fruit from sacrifice of the Cross active in our lives. In this way we follow the example of Jesus who surrendered his life to the Father. And that power from the Cross and Resurrection then manifests itself again in a special way to those who don't believe - that they can see how the resurrection builds the lives of individuals into a community of unity and communion among us. When the peace of Christ manifests itself in our lives, it is a sign to others of the truth of the message of the Gospel.
