GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's Gospel is a follow-up from last Sunday's. In today's Gospel Jesus continues to speak of priorities in the lives of Christians. Our life is not made secure by what we own, even when we have more than we need. A worthy and purposeful life focussed merely on heaping up money or a material legacy is in reality an empty life. The rich man in the parable believed his future was secure, and that his good fortune was entirely due to his own merits. But his life was God's to give and God's to take away. Virtue is found midway between extremes. The rich fool spent his energies on piling riches. The other extreme would be to see no value at all in working for a living. We should apply this to our appetite for money. On the one hand we have the voluntary poverty of Jesus; on the other side, we need worldly goods, a place to live and money to live on. There are many ways to use money responsibly. Someone rich who uses that wealth to provide worthwhile employment is doing more than one who claims to believe the gospel but does nothing for the welfare of others. We "lay up treasure in heaven", by living with integrity, not only honouring God but also caring for our neighbour.
