GOSPEL REFLECTION

The parable of this Sunday's Gospel speaks of receiving the Word of God and letting it sprout and produce an abundant harvest in our lives. Where do we hear the Word of God? We're meant to hear the Word of God in the readings of the Mass, and even though there's no substitute for hearing God's word in church, the richest soil for God's message is in the home. The home atmosphere must be the right soil, if it's to be a good place for growth. If space is made for God in the home, if parents pray with their children from an early age, if they treat each other with love, if joining in Mass, as Christ's memorial, really matters to the parents, there is a fair chance that the seed will take root and grow in their children's hearts! It doesn't always happen, but on balance, it is the best chance that it will! In a sense, education is what remains when you have forgotten the texts themselves. We forget so easily what was said in church or school. We never forget what happens in the home. Let us remember that God's call comes to us best when we are young. That's when most of us felt called to our particular vocations.
